GJCA Activities at the GCA Convention, Expo and Trade Show

Mark your calendars to attend the GCA Convention, Beef Expo, and Trade Show held on **April 2-5, 2008** at the Fairgrounds in Perry.

To kick off the junior activities, former NCBA President Jan Lyons will address your role as future leaders in the beef industry on **Friday at 3 p.m.** and refreshments will be provided for all who attend.

On **Friday night** there will be **FREE** pizza along with the **Beef Jeopardy** in the Miller-Murphy-Howard Building near the Cattlemen's Ball event. There will also be several other activities and free give-aways.



Saturday morning at the breakfast, junior sweepstakes awards will be presented. Beginning later that morning is the **Beef Expo Judging Contest** and that afternoon will be the judging contest and GJCA awards presentation.

GJCA will once again host the **photography contest**. Entries are due at the convention/expo on **April 2**. Members not attending the convention must submit their entries to the GCA office no later than **March 28**. Beef Industry Scholarship Challenge

The Georgia Junior Cattlemen's Association has begun making plans to host the 4th Annual Beef Industry Scholarship Challenge. The contest will be **June 7, 2008** at UGA's Animal and Dairy Science Building in Athens, Ga. High school juniors and seniors from any state in NCBA's Region II are invited to enter the competition.

Ten teams will be accepted in the competition, with preference given to Georgia residents. Teams will consist of three members and can be juniors and/or seniors in high school. Juniors may compete again as seniors unless they are on the first place team. Team members do not need to be from the



same high school or county.

The Beef Industry Scholarship Challenge is a unique contest that focuses on the student's knowledge and skills in all areas of beef production management. Teams will work through 10 challenging stations in a 25-minute rotation: handling and health, nutrition, marketing, seedstock merchandising, keep-cull replacement heifers, job interview, beef industry issues, reproduction, beef management challenge, and credit and finance. The beef industry issues section has been updated to more closely mimic how students interact in real-world settings.

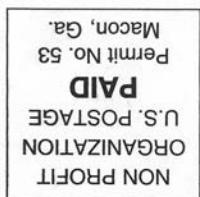
